Comment: Washoe County is unable to definitively determine the amount of future revenues and expenditures associated with processing Concealed Carry Weapon (CCW) permit applications because the total number of future permit applications is unknown. Based on historical trends from the past two years and actual data for the first seven months of FY 2025, it is projected that extending the period of validity for CCWs from 5 to 10 years would result in a decrease in annual permit fee revenues of \$114,608. A corresponding offset in expenses associated with processing permit applications is also anticipated in the first five years following the extension of the validity period. However, in the years following, the expenses associated with renewals of CCW permits is expected to increase as the review will need to cover a longer period of time. Again, because the total number of future permit applications is unknown a reliable estimate of the fiscal effect of this bill on Washoe County cannot be determined.
