BDR 15-342 (SB60) is adding to the list of crimes that are eligible for an "elder" sentencing enhancement. The bill becomes effective upon passage and approval.

The agency has reviewed the bill and determined that additional sentence enhancements will result in longer prison and/or supervision terms. Longer terms could result in an increased number of supervision officers required by the division. The Division does not possess the necessary data to estimate a number of convictions to determine whether the increase could be absorbed by existing staff or would require additional staff. Therefore, the total impact of this bill cannot be determined at this time. The agency reserves the right to go to the Interim Finance Committee for the future biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
