News Media Accreditation Information

83rd (2025) Legislative Session

Welcome members of the media to the 83rd (2025) Legislative Session. This page provides relevant information related to the news media accreditation process. If you are a member of a bona fide news medium, such as a reporter, a journalist or a camera operator for a news media outlet, and you plan to use news media space in the Senate or Assembly chambers, you must follow the news media accreditation steps that are outlined on this informational page.

The first step in the news media accreditation process is to complete and file an application for accreditation as a member of a bona fide news medium with the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau, which can be found at the News Media Accreditation Request page. Once you submit your application, you may report to the Legislative Building in Carson City or the Nevada Legislature Office Building in Las Vegas to take a photograph for your press badge. The Legislative Building is located at 401 S. Carson Street, Carson City, Nevada 89701. At this location, you may have your photograph taken Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. The Nevada Legislature Office Building is located at 7230 Amigo Street, Las Vegas, Nevada 89119. At this location, you may have your photograph taken Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Upon receipt of a completed application, the Director will review the application for compliance with Joint Standing Rule No. 25 and, upon approval of the application by the Majority Leader of the Senate or Speaker of the Assembly, prepare a press badge for you. Once you obtain your press badge, your name will be sent to the Senate and Assembly for purposes of reading or entering your name into the record. You will not be considered accredited until your name is read or entered into the record of each House.
